**\$800 ALIMONY  
ORDERED PAID

**Milford Haven Sued  
By U.S. Wife**

New York, Oct. 8 (AP)—The American-born Marchioness Romaine Mountbatten of Milford Haven won \$800 a month temporary alimony Thursday pending trial of her suit for separation or divorce.

She brought suit on grounds of cruelty and desertion and also charged her husband, David Mountbatten, Marquess of Milford Haven, with adultery.

State Supreme court Justice James B. M. McNally, in granting the temporary alimony, noted that "misconduct is alleged with a Hungarian actress, one Eva Bartok, referred to in the husband's papers as Mrs. Wordsworth."

The titled husband, best man at the wedding of Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain and Prince Philip, has entered a counterclaim for separation.

McNally also awarded the marchioness' attorney, Harold H. Corbin, \$7,500 for his services and traveling expenses.
