

## \$800 ALIMONY ORDERED PAID BY MARQUESS

## Milford Haven Sued By U.S. Wife

New York, Oct. 8 (AP)—The American-born Marchioness Romaine Mountbatten of Milford Haven won \$800 a month temporary alimony Thursday pending trial of her suit for separation or divorce.

She brought suit on grounds of cruelty and desertion and also charged her husband. David Mountbatten, Marquess of Milford Haven, with adultery.

State Supreme court Justice Justice Justice Manager B. M. McNally, in grant-ling the temporary alimony, noted that "misconduct is alteged with a Hungarian actress, one Eva Barlok, referred to in the husband's papers as Mrs. Wordsworth."

The titled hysband, best man at the wedding of Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain and Prince Philip, has entered a counterclaim for separation.

McNally also awarded the marchioness attorney, Harold H. Corbin, \$7,500 for his services and traveling expenses.
