Bator Named Consultant To Treasury

Francis M. Bator, until recently deputy Special Assistant to the President, will retain a key advisory role within the Administration despite resumption this month of a teaching post in Cambridge, Mass.

Bator will be a special consultant to Treasury Secretary Henry H. Fowler, and will also join the special monetary advisory committee headed by former Treasury Secretary Douglas Dillon.

His full-time responsibility will be as Professor of Political Economy at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. He will also be director of Studies in the Schools Institute of Politics.

Formerly at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Bator played a key role, as White House representative, in the recent Kennedy Round and international liquidity negotiations.
