AZARY (Page 16)

Coat of Arms. In the picture on a green back-ground, an armored knight with a helmet under an oaktree, his left arm posed in the hip, in his right hand aspect, or rather short sword, ready to stab a rushing wild boar. Family heirloom which has never been awarded. This coat of arms has been certified by King Matthias II d. d. Pressburg (Hung: Pozsony; Slovak: Bratislava) the 12th of December 1688 announced in Zemplin, Zempliner Comitatus (Zemplén County) the 18th of May 1910 to Peter AZARI-Nagy as owner, and to his brothers Thomas, John and Paul as co-owners.

(The same title was declared again in Miskolcz, Borsod County, on the 17th June 1801.)

The descendants of this title in Zemplén County were ^(are) wealthy and used ^(use) the Family name AZARI.

AZARI II. (Page 16)

The coat of arms portrays on green background a big lion, faced by a knight with a curved sword, whose point is thrust through the neck of a decapitated skull of a Turk. — Family heirloom.

The lion is watching.
