Hungarian Ex-Industrialist Warns of Malenkov Talk

Charles de Barcza, former Hungarian industrialist and diplomat, warned yesterday that the Western world should not be taken in by the protestations of peace and co-operation, made in a recent speech by Stalin's successor, Malenkov.

Addressing the student body of Trinity College, he said a more accurate index of Soviet intentions was a cynical speech by Matyas Rakosi, Communist boss of Hungary, who described the "salami tactics" of Communist conquest. This strategy is based on the fact that you cannot bite salami, because it is too hard, but you can cut it slice by slice.

"Slice by slice, they purged the non-Communist parties in Hungary," said Mr. De Barcza, who was for 20 years, charge d'affaires of the Knights of Malta in Budapest, "and that is what they would like to do in other democratic countries."
