H<sup>15</sup> captivating memoirs describe his escape from Austria in 1938, and how he then practiced medicine – in fantastic succession – on a notorious street in Paris, at an Ivory Coast clinic, a French prison camp (where the choicest pâté and nothing else was served three times a day), and at long last, in New York. There he delivered everything from groceries to kittens – before he finally became a doctor-with-a-country.
