

Bartók, Béla 1881^{3/25} - 1945 Sep. 26²⁴

pianist and composer, born 1881, most outstanding figure in H. folk music, composer of operas, pantomimes, concert pieces.

Arrived in U.S. Oct., 1940, with his wife, Ditta Pásztor, who is also a pianist of renown. (NY Tim. June 28, P. 6, Sect. 8.)

At the beginning of 1942, he was mentioned by the leaders of the "Independent Hungary" movement, that in case the opposition to Eckhardt's leadership becomes too strong, they themselves propose that Bartók should take his place who secretly is a member of the movement. (See: Bélar)
