Rabbi Silent At Nursing Home Probe

A New York rabbi who oped are a nationwide string of nursing homes invoked the Fifth Amendment yesterdaw when senators attempted to question him about alleged fraud in the billion dollar mursing home industry.

Dr. Bernard Dergman pleaded unsuchessfull) of other constitutional grounds against testifying before he invoked his Fifth Amendment right to refuse to anyer questions on the grounds of possible self-incrimination. Sen. Frank E. Moss, (D. Utah), acting chairman of the Senate Special Committee on Aging, refused to accept Bergman's first objections but said he had no choice but to accept the refusal to answer under the Fifth Amendment guarantee.

Bergman's lawyer, National Lewin, said it would be "improper" and "syngle unfair" to compel Bergman to testify, because his operation of the Towers nitraing bothe in New York is under erininal investigation by both state and federal agencies.

Even after Bergman's refusal to testify Sen. Charles H. Percy (R-III), pressed him to explain how he had "partayed" \$30,000 into more than \$24 million through nuring papers operations. Berg-

man dectined to answer.

Bergman said he would
exemptually provide the committee with all these answers,"
after criminal proceedings
warainst him are resolved.

Bergman is a central figure in more than a dozen federal, state and local investigations of charges ranging from oversedation of elderly patients to padding payrolls.

A New York State Assembly committee has said Bergman controls a nationwide empire of more than 100 nursing homes.
