

Black, Louis

(1844-1919)

BORN in Somos, Sáros County, Hungary, 1844.

When 10 yrs old, came to America, spent 7 years
in the schools of Cleveland, Ohio. Enlisted in
Civil War in 1863, served ^{as private} with 150th Ohio
^{Co. A} regt, in 1863-64. After war, his father died
shortly (Morris Black). He entered the firm of
D. Black and Co., later became head of it.
In 1884⁸³ member of City Council of Cleveland,
in 1886 Fire Commissioner, later head of Fire
Dept. - Was Colonel of Second Ohio Regt. for
8 years. Held high offices in Knights of
Pythias. *Treasurer of Bailey Co.*
