

Maj. Bodrogi Dies; Personnel Officer

Maj. Michael L. Bodrogi, 37, military personnel officer of the Military District of Washington, died yesterday at Walter Reed Hospital after a five-month illness. He lived at 1007 Wakefield drive, Alexandria.

He was assigned here in Jan

uary, 1950.

Born in Mount Olivet, III, he entered the Army as an enlisted man in 1929 at the age of 15. In 1942 he was commissioned in the Infantry at Fort Benning, Ga.

Maj. Bodrogi fought in World War II in Central Europe, with the 86th Infantry Division and was awarded the Combat Infantry badge and a Bronze Star, His principal assignments included those of personnel director of the Alaska General Depot, executive officer of Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio, and battalion executive officer at Fort Knox, Ky.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Helen Baran Bodrogi, and a daughter, Kathleen, 4, of the Alexandria address; two brothers, Joseph Bodrogi, Irvington, N. J., and John Bodrogi, Patterson, N. J., and sister, Mrs. Edward Cladis, Passaic, N. J.

Mass will be held at 10 a.m. Eriday at the Fort Myer Chapel. Burial will be in Arlington Cemetery.
