Titus de Bobula,
Architect, Lived
20 Years in Area

Titus de Bobula, 84, an architect who in 1920 designed for himself a modern castle at Spuyten Duyvil on the Hudson River in New York State, died yesterday at District General Hospital.

Mr. de Bobula, born in Budapest, designed a Greek Orthodox cathedral in Pittsburgh, a number of churches, apartments and high schools, a factory and a municipal center.

He was graduated from the University of Budapest and came to this country in his early 20s. He received a degree from New York University.

He had lived in the Washington area for 20 years. He and his wife Eurana last lived at 1830 Seventeenth street N.W. He leaves no other survivors. Services and burial will be in Bethlehem, Pa.
