The Pump Room of the Ambassador East, on Chicago's Gold Coast, became the gathering place of movie and stage folks, artists, opera performers and other celebrities. It was there that Mr. By-field introduced dinners served Ernest L. Byfield from a flaming sword. "It doesn't seem to hurt the food much and the customers seem to like it," he observed. Members of the Hollywood colony traveling between coasts rarely passed through Chicago without lunching with Mr. Byfield in the Pump Room. Many of the living rooms of his Ambassador East bear silver door plates carrying the
