Bavaria Moves to Prevent 'Invasion' by 1,000 Gypsies

MUNICH, Germany, Dec. 19 (AP) — The state of Bavaria announced today that it had stopped a threatened "invasion" by 1.000 gypsies who planned to cross into Germany by air and auto.

The Bavarian Interior Ministry said the first contingents, numbering about 45, tried to enter West Germany without immigration visas over the past several weeks. They were jailed or deported.
