PREFACE

This bibliography contains selected English language sources on Hungarian ethnography and related disciplines. The more peripheral subject areas are represented only by important general works or by those having some anthropological content. More specialized works are included for fields of study which are central to anthropological research, and for areas in which Hungarian scholars are particularly noted.

Following the basic source list, a separate section provides entries for the major bibliographic references on Hungary. In addition, there is a subject index for quick reference on pages 22 - 24.
