

Jennie Feld, 89; Mother Of Ringling Circus Head

Jennie Feld, 89, mother of entrepreneur Irvin Feld, died Friday in Washington Adventist Hospital after a stroke. She lived on Van Ness Street NW.

Born in a suburb of Budapest, Hungary, the former Jennie Mansh came to this country by herself at the age of 16 and settled in Hagerstown, Md.

In 1904 she married Isaac Feld, a native of Poland who was in the retail clothing business.

The Felds lived in Baltimore between 1935 and 1940, when they moved to the District. Feld died in 1946.

Mrs. Feld was an active member of Washington Hebrew Congregation.

She usually was at parties for performers of the Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey Circus during the circus' annual visit here. Her son, Irvin Feld of the District, is president and producer of the circus.

She also leaves four daughters, Fannie, of the District, Zelda Fribush and Doris Goldstein of Silver Spring, and Freda Arenson

of Sarasota, Fla.; nine grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.

Another son, Israel, died in 1972.

Services were held yesterday at Washington Hebrew Congregation, Massachusetts Avenue and Macomb Street NW, with burial in Adas Israel Hebrew Congregation Cemetery.
