Margaret G. Dudas was born, reared and educated in Europe. She studied at St. Chrischona, a Missionary School in Switzerland, and completed her studies in Budapest, where she received a Master Degree for "Fine Art of Needle Work." After another year of Theology here, she returned to Switzerland and devoted her time to an orphan's home. A year later she sailed to America to further her Theological studies.

Aside from living a busy and useful life, this remarkable woman has established an enviable reputation for herself as a writer. She has written extensively for both national and foreign papers and periodicals, including dailies, monthlies, Protestant and Catholic papers. She has also written a book in Hungarian, which transcribed means "Infinite Love," and weaves short stories around the lives of Hungarian-Americans in this country. Because of her ability to speak several languages, and because of her wide travel experiences throughout Europe from London to Budapest, and from Naples to Stockholm, and throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico, she became a well-known Hollywood correspondent, and has interviewed many famous people.
