

MRS. RUTH FARKAS

• Mrs. Ruth L. Farkas, wife of a multi-millionaire owner of a New York City department store chain. The couple gave \$300,000 to the Nixon race after Mrs. Farkas was told in the summer of 1972 that she might be named ambassador to Luxembourg.

Most of her money — roughly \$200,000 — was given after the election was over, when the Nixon campaign had no apparent need for the money. After the Star-News disclosed the belated contributions, the controversy delayed her Senate approval, but she eventually was confirmed for the Luxembourg post last spring.

Mrs. Farkas \$300,000 pledge was made to Stans. According to the Senate hearings, Rep. Louis C. Wyman, R.N.H., who told her she was under consideration for the post, was the same person who introduced Mrs. Farkas to Stans to offer the contribution a month or so later.
